Questions to address

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- Proposal must quickly address the following questions
 - What does the proposer want to do?
 - How much will it cost?
 - Is the problem important and relevant to the funder's interests?
 - Will the proposed activity solve or reduce the problem?
 - Can the proposed activity be done?
 - Will it duplicate other work?

Questions to address (con't)

• Con't...

- Is the method or approach Appropriate, Clearly define, and Well thought out?
- Can the results be adequately evaluated?
- Is the proposer qualified to do the activity or work? Better qualified than others?
- Will the results of the activity be available to others?
- Are the proposed schedule of activity and budget reasonable?

Sources of proposals

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- Request for Proposals [RFP]
 - o Given out by funder
 - Normally found through know sources web, colleagues, ect.

• Examples

- NSF National Science Foundation
- NIH National Institute for Health

Instructions

- Must follow exactly
- Much more strict than a conference or journal paper

- Table of Contents
- Introduction
 - Problem addressed
 - o Purpose or objectives of proposed activity
